### "Coming to" Learn

My sobriety date is October 23, 1987. That's almost 36 years to save the calculation. I have been on this earth for 60 years, however it feels like I've had at least 120 years of experiences. My message today is to always stay grounded in AA somehow, someway. My sponsor's sponsor recently passed along this message...you can add programs, studies, classes, etc. to AA but you can't remove AA from those studies. I tested that theory and I concluded that she was right. I entered a school of another spiritual path at the beginning of 2016 - an indepth spiritual study focusing on expanding your consciousness, and like a good over-doer proceeded to get fully integrated. I was a student

and quickly became a teacher and then was quite heavily involved in general. I was so integrated that I lived in the school building in OKC. It was all volunteer work. I eventually didn't have time for AA. I had become very complacent

and couldn't really
"hear" in meetings anymore. Drinking wasn't
my problem anymore,
however I forgot about
our nature of switching
addictions. This alcoholic does things hard
most of the time. It has

gotten better over the years but at most key times I don't stop until I drop. That's been a lifetime healing process - to learn what enough is, and I'm still not there yet. I work hard, love hard, play hard, study hard, and friend hard. I had quit AA several times-The last time being January of 2020. My friend was worried about me, called me one day and said, "I found our meeting." I said, "I'll try it one time and will decide then." Well, I ended up going for a couple of years. It was a non-listed meeting, period. Enough said. To summarize, in hindsight my spirituality had gotten too fancy. In October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022, my life as I had known it. over the last 7 years came to an abrupt halt. I

worked, supported, loved, friended, schooled until I dropped. I abruptly quit the school because I had hit the bottom of overdoing. I dropped. Come to find out the overdoing that I meticulously nurtured my whole life was keeping me from revealing my deepest traumas from childhood. I had peeled lots of the onion over the last 35 vears but we are not ready until we are ready. Because I had separated myself from the 2<sup>nd</sup> love of my life, the school, I was so, so, so lost. It felt like I was in shock for months. I also let go of 2 significant relationships at the same time. Two close friends. What I was ready to face now was the very effective and polished codependent in me. And here the whole time I thought I was helping by doing all the things hard.

There were threads of help and love woven through those relationships but the good codependent was escaping her life to "help" others. It takes "It's in our greatest pain and fear that we become willing to be open and be humble again.

what it takes. I'm currently getting to know her and I have "come to" learn her favorite thing is enmeshment. And when I say I'm "coming to" learn, I mean learning and understanding deep into my heart. Sometimes the pain has to be deep enough to crack the heart wide open so the light can shine in. It doesn't feel like heaven but it is a true gift. It's in our greatest pain and fear that we become willing to be open and be humble again. We can all of the sudden hear again on a deeper level.

Head knowledge doesn't equal understanding. I believe the learning process looks like a slinky. The lessons come round and round and round spiraling upward even when it feels like a step back. Nothing is wasted in this life unless we don't learn from it. Sometimes I think learning is invisible. All we have to do is take the action and turn the outcome over to God. When I understand

something, I feel a shift happen....an ah-ha moment Artis G used to say. An understanding of the heart. I believe that there is no right or wrong, good or bad - there is only learning, which is precisely why we are in the schoolroom of life. So, if you walk away with one thing from this story I would hope it would be that we are all, and I mean all, beautiful. loving children of God. We all come with gifts, we all count-and like I said there are no mistakes, only experiences that help us get closer to God. I am learning how to forgive myself from the heart. It's not a brain thing. You have to feel it. I also believe that as long as we are here on earth there is always something else to learn. So we may as well let go and let God, rest a little, have a little fun, go to a meeting, use a sponsor, work the Program, and not take ourselves so seriously. God bless.



This pamphlet is geared directly toward individuals who come to understand that they are alcoholic late in life. There are multiple stories in the pamphlet which illustrate the circumstances of their lives and the role alcohol played in them. They began drinking alcohol at various stages of their live, one even becoming a drinker at the age of 66. The stories show that alcoholism comes in many different forms and "a variety of disguises."

"Many crises accompany the process of growing older, and almost all of them entail loss of some sort. The children grow up and leave home. You move to a smaller place. Friends are fewer and farther apart. You are obliged to retire from work. Physical health is less robust and faculties diminish. Your partner of many years dies. Sometime these changes in circumstances make a long-standing habit worse."

However, as the pamphlet is subtitled, it is Never Too Late!
